This report provides data on persons employed in the Hotel Industry in The Bahamas by

occupation, sex, average hours worked and average basic wages per week for the year

2009. The report is based on information obtained from an administrative data source of

leading hotels, which account for approximately fifty percent (50%) of total employment

in all hotels operating in The Bahamas in 2009. Though limited in this respect, the

results do provide valuable information on occupations, average basic wages (not

including mandatory and other gratuities for tip category workers) and average hours

worked in the hotel sector.

The Department of Statistics wishes to acknowledge the valuable cooperation and

assistance of participating agencies such as the Department of Labour, Bahamas Hotel

Employers' Association (BHEA) and The Bahamas Hotel Catering & Allied Workers

DATA HIGHLIGHTS

In 2008 and again in 2009 the number of workers in the Hotel Industry was less than in 2007. In 2008 there was a 6% decline over the 2007 figure and between 2008 and 2009 the decline was even greater at 8%. In both New Providence and Grand Bahama the numbers declined over this period with the decrease being higher in New Providence.

Nationwide the average wage increased from \$359 to \$365. In New Providence this increase was 1%, in Grand Bahama and the Family Islands the increase was noticeably higher at 5%.

Within the Industry both males and females worked an average of 39 hours per week.

Service Workers and Shop and Market Sales Workers was the largest occupational group, accounting for 35% of all workers in 2009.

Senior Officials and Managers earned the highest average weekly wage of \$796 per week, which was \$2 less than the average wage for 2008. In 2009 the lowest average weekly wage, \$239, was posted in the Elementary Occupational group.

A comparison of the 2009 data with that of 2008 show that the largest decrease in weekly wage for males was \$34 which occurred in the Plant and Machine Operators and Assemblers group. While the largest increase, \$59 was recorded in the Professionals category.

In 2009, the overall average weekly wage for females was \$12 higher than that of 2008. Contributing to this increase for females was a hike of \$61 in the Skilled Agriculture and Fishery Workers group.
