ROMORA BAY RESORT GIVES BACK TO ITS EMPLOYEES AND THE COMMUNITY



BHTA member, Romora Bay Resort and Marina on Harbour Island, has like all of our partner resorts and hotels, been faced with the grim reality faced by the ramifications of the COVID 19 virus. Like most hotels, they have had to layoff close to 50 employees, and our operating with a skeleton crew of mostly volunteer managers.

Their two restaurants, Sunsets on the Bay & Acquapazza have remained open, strictly on a To-Go basis, and within the guidelines of the governments lock down regulations. This has allowed them to feed the few vessels left in their marina as well as provide an option for the community. In addition, and since they would be open, Romora's Sunsets on the Bay, has provided a daily lunch to the officers on duty with the Royal Bahamas Police Force. They have provided these lunches since day one, and will continue to do so until the lockdowns are lifted.

Two weeks ago, they put a program together that provided groceries to every one of their employees. The program was very well received, and gave the Romora management team, whom was behind the idea, a much bigger idea.

They have now created the "Romora Bay Employee and Community Fund". Beyond the Resort, they recognize that the community is struggling as well.

Their Relief Fund operates not only for their employees, but for the community. Of the money raised, half will go directly to the Romora Bay staff who have been laid off. The other half will be used to assist the beloved local community as every business and family in Harbour Island and Eleuthera has been severely impacted by the business shutdowns.

-100% of all funds raised will be distributed – there are no administrative or management fees.

-50% will be given to our employees to help them and their families get through the next few months of unemployment.

-50% will be donated to our community through a food distribution program we will set up, manage, and logistically distribute to those in need.

-All food items purchased to donate will be bought locally from local grocery stores and vendors. This will help keep the wheel in motion and provide income for local grocery stores and small business owners in Eleuthera and Harbour Island, so that they may continue to provide their much-needed services, as well as provide for their employees.
